WHAT DIFFERENT TYPES OF SUPPORT CAN WE OFFER?



KS3 preventative placement

Students who are at risk of exclusion can be referred for a 12 week programme at one of the Aspire Schools: Blueprint, CSEC or The Wycombe Grange. During this time we will work with students on finding and using strategies that help them manage their behaviour and emotions. We will also do various assessments that will help mainstream schools understand students' needs, and be better placed to support them when they return.



KS4 vocational programme

KS4 students can attend Blueprint or CSEC part time for the whole of their KS4 in order to add some vocational options to their timetable. In this way students can maintain a connection with their mainstream school, their existing friends and support network, but also have KS4 provision that engages them in meaningful vocational qualifications. This model can be highly effective at preventing exclusion.



KS4 Full time provision

If a student is in KS4, Aspire can consider taking them until the end of KS4. This gives students who are struggling in mainstream the ability to be supported with us, and to have the stability of knowing where they will be for the rest of their KS4. It means they can follow a consistent curriculum for this time, which increases the likelihood of positive outcomes. We will also work intensively with these students on post 16 destinations to prevent them becoming NEET.



EHCP nurture provision

Shortenills Nurture Provision can be named as a long-term placement for students with EHCPs for their Social, Emotional and/or Mental Health (SEMH). The local authority must consult with Aspire as to whether we can meet students' needs. **This provision is only for students with EHCPs for SEMH needs**, and placing is done through the EHCP consultation process, with intakes in September each year.

Aspire Schools

Charges at Aspire Schools vary depending on the type of placement and the needs of the student.

For **KS3 students on a 12 week programme**, the Local Authority subsidises the programme by £22.50 per day for 12 weeks. The cost to schools is therefore:

- No pupil premium = £22.50 per day
- With pupil premium = £25 per day
- With EHCP = £67.50 per day
- With EHCP and pupil premium = £70 per day

For **KS4 students who attend one or two days a week on the vocational programme**, the Local Authority subsidises by £22.50 per day. The cost to schools is therefore:

- No pupil premium = £22.50 per day
- With pupil premium = £25 per day
- With EHCP = £67.50 per day
- With EHCP and pupil premium = £70 per day

For **any other full or part time placements** where students are dual registered:

- No pupil premium = £45 per day
- With pupil premium = £50 per day
- With EHCP = £90 per day
- With EHCP and pupil premium = £95 per day

On occasion, a school may refer a student with an EHCP for whom needs cannot be met on the EHCP rates above. In this instance, we will talk to the school about the total cost of meeting this student's needs. This may also apply in rare cases for students without EHCPs.
